With tax season quickly approaching, be aware of misleading information that scammers are sending out regarding your tax refunds, credits or payments.

- Watch out for misleading tax advice on social media with the promise of a big payday. This bad advice could urge you to falsify tax forms or credit claims that can lead to penalties, investigations, and prosecution.
- Be aware of phone calls, emails or texts demanding you to pay taxes followed by threats. These tactics are used to steal your identity and impersonate you to claim your benefits.
- Be suspicious of tax-related links that end in ".com, .net, .org," or anything that does not end in ".gov."
 Malicious actors often set up fake websites that look like the real thing with the intent to steal your identity.
